Public Charities and Foundations Benefit Pennsylvania Communities

Deliver vital community services

• The food banks comprising Feeding Pennsylvania collectively serve more than 2 million hungry individuals each year by delivering more than 110 million pounds of food. In 2012, the organization's 48,000 volunteers gave over 325,000 hours to fighting hunger.

Give voice to the people they serve

 The Philadelphia-based National Nursing Centers Consortium supports the advancement of nurse-led care through developing vital resources for these skilled medical professionals. In 2014, NNCC launched a web-portal called LawAtlas.org, that will enable smaller clinics reserve their resources for community health services.

Contribute to vibrant communities

• The Erie Junior Philharmonic Orchestra completed its 99th season in 2013 and is the third oldest youth orchestra in the country. Talented musicians in grades 5 through 12 hail from 30 metro-area schools to perform classical and contemporary works throughout the year, and the program's alumni have gone on to become professionals.

Advance solutions for challenges facing society

The Pittsburgh Foundation is one of the nation's oldest community foundations, leading
the city and its surrounding neighborhoods towards a more inclusive education system,
healthy lifestyles, and responsive government. In 2013, its Talent City initiative helped
screen over 1,500 candidates for senior positions in the incoming Mayor Peduto's office
to craft an administration that will renew the city's development.

Economic Impact of Pennsylvania's Nonprofit Sector

- Employs 727,200 people almost 13.3% of the state's workforce
- Generates \$109.8 billion in annual revenues
- Holds assets of \$249 billion
- Pennsylvania foundations give \$1.6 billion annually
- Pennsylvanians give \$6.0 billion to charity each year
