USING THESE ELEMENTS, WE HAVE DEVELOPED INDICATORS WHICH FOCUS ON CREATING POSITIVE CHANGE IN BOTH PEOPLE AND PLACE

- Increase median housing value
- Increase, then stabilize median residential sales price
- Increase homeownership rate
- Increase the ratio of owner vs. renter occupied housing
- Decrease the percentage of vacant : land
- Decrease percentage of vacant housing units
- Increase, then stabilize private and public investments
- Decrease, then stabilize percentage of subsidized housing
- Increase diversity of income-levels : across neighborhood
- Decrease tax delinquent parcels
- Decrease foreclosure rate
- : Increase diverse and affordable housing types available for all income : levels
- Increase the number of small businesses

- Increase median household income
- Decrease unemployment rate
- Decrease the number of residents living below poverty level
- Decrease the housing burden (30%+ of income spent on housing)
- Decrease percentage of buildings with code violations
- Decrease percentage of vacant homes and lots
- Increase access to mental health services
- Decrease crime rate
- Increase access to healthy foods
- Decrease unemployment rate
- Increase individual wealth and savings
- Increase connectivity and accessibility to neighborhood ammenities

- Increase people's reporting of image and confidence
- Increase investment in repair and improvement projects
- Increase number of positive neighborhood stories
- Increase community signage installations
- Increase number of public art projects/neighborhood beautification/ placemaking projects

- Increase in unemployed and underemployed workers gaining access to living-wage jobs (number of hires, percent of total hires)
- Increase number of contracts going to: entrepreneurs of color (number, dollar value, percent of total contracts)
- Increase access to affordable homes in high-opportunity and redeveloping neighborhoods (number of housing units: available for households at 50% of AMI or below - \$25,942)
- Decrease the number of low-income residents involuntarily being displaced from their neighborhoods (number of evictions)
- Decrease the housing burden (30%+ of income spent on housing)
- Increase preservation of affordable housing units
